


Historical view: percentage of population that view membership in the EU as a 'bad thing'






Proportion of UK exports going to EU (27 other members) and Commonwealth (51 other members)

WHAT IS THE IRISH BORDER BACKSTOP?



Under the terms of the transition period in Theresa May's plan, the UK stays in the Single Market and the Customs Union until the end of 2020. This means that all goods, services, capital and labour can move between Ireland, Northern Ireland and the UK without being checked. A situation that bureaucrats call frictionless trade



Under Theresa May's deal, the backstop comes into force if the UK and the EU fail to strike a trade deal after 2020. To preserve the frictionless border with the Republic of Ireland, Northern Ireland will stay aligned with most EU single market rules. This means goods can move over the Irish border without checks. The whole UK will stay in the Customs Union which means most goods can travel between Northern Ireland and Britain without checks. However some checks will be necessary on some goods, such as agricultural products, because the EU's single market rules still apply



If Britain abandons Theresa May's plan and leaves the EU without a deal, there will be a hard border between Northern Ireland and the Republic. This means all goods and people travelling between the two will be subjected to heavy checks. The Republic of Ireland does not like this arrangement because it threatens the Good Friday agreement that secured peace and ended the Troubles
